Visits to the Most Precious Blood and St Peter's, Vauxhall, Saturday 9 November

Ten members visited two very different Lewis organs. That at the Most Precious Blood, near London Bridge, was relocated relatively recently from St Mary's, Battersea Rise, where it had been stuck in a corner. It is now arranged over the back of the church and speaks well into the space. Members enjoyed trying out a wide variety of repertoire, which it is capable of. (There's even a "transpose" dial!) The afternoon found us at St Peter's, Vauxhall, a much smaller organ which had been installed the "wrong" way round — with the Great pipework behind the Swell but with some particularly beautiful diapasons, demonstrated by the church organist Will Fraser.
