Recent SSLSO events

Visits to the Guards' Chapel and St Mary the Boltons on Saturday 8 March.

Twelve SSLSO members visited the extraordinary Guards' chapel in Birdcage Walk. This looks nondescript from the outside, but was quite spectacular inside. The organist, Martin Ford, demonstrated the organ, aided by a remarkable app on his phone that made the organ play remotely on his command. The organ has 3 manuals but 4 divisions (the Great comprises two separate divisions); so there was plenty to explore. We could also go to the military band's gallery, opposite the organ, for a good view. Two-and-a-half hours went very quickly!

In the afternoon, we moved on to St Mary the Boltons, where our member John Ward very kindly demonstrated the 2-manual Compton, which had a remarkable variety of tone colours to try out. Many thanks to the team at St Mary's for a very warm welcome.

The London Festival of Contemporary Church Music takes place from Friday 9 May to Sunday 18 May, based at St Pancras Church (details at lfccm.com). The Festival was founded by Dr Christopher Batchelor in 2002, who has just retired from St Pancras Church after 37 years of service (see Church Times, 28 March).

The IAO Eastern Region Organ Day, to which SSLSO members are invited, is Saturday 31 May, 10.30am-4.30pm. The keynote address will be given by Alexander Berry, of Great St Mary's, Cambridge, on encouraging and training young people in church music. The composite recital will include our member Alan Langridge performing Bach's Prelude in B minor BWV 544. The finishing time should allow people to attend evensong at one of the college chapels.
